Nina Corder is originally from Malaysia; but resides in Toledo for the past 22 years. She is the proud Founder and Managing Director of a grassroots women-focus nonprofit organization-Inclusive for Women Inc. DBA Woman of Toledo (WOT). Establish in 2013, as part of her Doctoral Degree dissertation in Organizational Leadership, now the organization become a hub where a diverse group of women's leaders committed to bringing together a community to learn from and about each other at advocating for Diversity, Inclusion and Belonging with a focus on Women Economic Empowerment.

Other than managing WOT operation, Nina also consults with various national and international agencies as Global Relocation - Destination Services Consultant. From the pre-assignment trip, home and school search, community orientation, to arrival welcoming and departure assistance, Nina help ease the transition for employees, family and help companies reduce the complexity of international relocation. Over the past four years, Nina have consulted 40 project assignments from 28 different countries. Currently, Nina is actively consulting with assignees working for fortune 500 companies in Northwest Ohio. In her lifetime, Nina has worked and lived in five countries, and traveled to more than 20 countries around the world. Hence, she is very effective at assisting relocating individuals and families with the many details of settling-in, cross-cultural training and transitioning into a new community.

In 2016, Nina joined and served as a member of the White House Council on Women & Girls under Obama Administration and begin her work representing District 9 -Ohio Delegates lobbying for Title IX in Capital Hill, Washington DC. In 2017 to 2018, Nina were appointed by the United Nation (UN) Women- Empower Women Initiative as Global Champions for Change. During her tenure with the UN Women, Nina launched Women Economic Empowerment movement in Northwest Ohio and developed a new initiative – HerHub. HerHub is an online platform that connect female community with local resources, women owned businesses and women led organizations in the area. Nina is also the current Executive Member for the City of Toledo, Human Relations Commission, Past- President of American Association of University Women (AAUW)-Toledo Branch and serve the City of Toledo's Committee on the Elimination of Discrimination against Women (CEDAW) ordinance. One of her accomplishment as local advocate in 2019, the passing of Pay Equity Act ordinance in the City of Toledo. The passing of this legislative is a critical step to closing the gender pay gap and improve woman's economic status.

As a catalyst for transformational change and social progress advocate, Nina seeks to provide services to those who in turn provide services to others. Her work focusses to forge partnerships with women organizations whose members lead and work with passion at the root-cause level of change. Nina enjoys conducting listening session with her female community. From her recent listening session, Nina discovered just as important as material wealth; power and autonomy, people's sense of control over the trajectory of their lives and being valued in the community, especially their sense of belonging to the community is important too. Therefore, she believes that the more we can challenge the status quo on current issues the higher the impact of the movement
