

Nina Corder (*legal name Shazlina Corder*) is originally from Malaysia but has resided in the United States of America, Ohio, for the past 25 years. Corder identifies herself as a social entrepreneur, working scholar, community leader, and humanitarian. She is the proud Founder and Executive Director of a grassroots women-focus nonprofit organization - Inclusive for Women Inc. dba <u>Woman of Toledo</u> (WOT). Established in 2013 as part of her research for Organizational Leadership, the organization has become a hub where diverse groups of women and girls lean in with the organization for support and mentorship. The organization effectively offers programs and services that help tackle issues critical to women's economic

advancement, workforce development, and empowerment. Through Corder's expansion and development efforts, the organization now manages two additional dba initiatives – the <u>Northwest Ohio Women's Business Council</u> and <u>HerHub</u>. Since its inception, Corder has successfully raised grants and capital funds totaling \$1.75M (USD) for all Inclusive for Women's initiatives serving over 10,300 women and youth.

Corder is also a principal owner of a social enterprise business, <u>Lemon Lime Company</u>, that offers operational and management consulting, on-site or remotely (virtual assistant), to businesses, companies, and individuals with a mission to provide leadership services and skills training to those who in turn provide services or products that aim to elevate the quality of lives of all humanity. Through her Lemon Lime Lab initiative, Corder has supported 15 women/families living in poverty across developing countries to receive quality work and earn a living wage from her Lemon and Lime, Co independent business network. Corder believes the most sustainable way to eradicate poverty is to give work, one job, one person at a time. In her lifetime, Corder has worked and lived in five countries and traveled to more than 25 countries around the world. Hence, she is highly effective at assisting individuals and families transition with the many details of settling in, cross-cultural training, working in a global workforce, and transitioning into a new community, workplace, or marketplace.

Global Citizen: From 2017 to 2018, Corder was appointed by the United Nations (UN) Women- Empower Women Initiative as the Global Champion for Change. During her fellowship tenure with the UN Women, Corder launched the Women Economic Empowerment movement with a mapping network in Northwest Ohio (USA) and developed an initiative – HerHub. HerHub is an online platform that connects the female community with local resources, women-owned businesses, and women-led organizations in the area. Currently, Corder is working on a social enterprise initiative – HerHub Global, that invests in women's economic empowerment and improves the status of women through a Human Rights lens. It is Corder's vision and goal to expand the women's hub – HerHub Global, to all seven continents of the world with a pilot expansion to begin in Africa, Europe, Far East, and Southeast Asia countries by the year 2025.

Corder's global efforts include expanding her leadership and human rights advocacy as a community leader and Mentor for the Professional Fellows program funded by the U.S. Department of State, Bureau of Educational and Cultural Affairs, Global Leaders Division. In 2022, Corder participated as a Mentor for a two-way Governance and Society Program entitled 'Shaping Participatory Democracy' for emerging leaders from Albania, Bulgaria, Hungary, Romania, Slovakia, and the United States. Corder's involvement also includes

providing training and consulting to visiting international delegations of <u>Open World</u> delegations from Ukraine and Moldova and visiting fellows from Hungary, a program funded by the Congress administered by the Congressional Office for International Leadership (COIL). Between 2023 and 2024, she participated once again as a Mentor on behalf of the National Committee on U.S.-China Relations, a nonprofit educational organization in New York, which works for dialogue and exchange between the peoples of the United States and China, Hong Kong, Mongolia, and Taiwan. Hence, Corder also expanded her global engagement in Southeast Asia (Malaysia, Thailand, Vietnam, and Singapore) as part of her continuing research on poverty and network gaps, where she began her mapping network project with a local team in the Asia Pacific.

In 2024, Corder was selected as one of the 25 delegations for the International Alliance of Women (Geneva) representatives of NGOs Consultative Status with the United Nations Economic and Social Council (ECOSOC). Corder joined approximately 7,000 delegates from across the globe for the sixty-eighth session of the Commission on the Status of Women (CSW68) at United Nations Headquarters, New York. CSW is the largest global gathering of civil society representatives, government officials, policymakers, and experts to progress on gender equality, discuss pressing issues, and agree on actions to transform the lives of women and girls everywhere.

Corder is an active facilitator and trainer for the World Academy for the Future of Women (<u>WAFW</u>), a program under Global Interactions, an NGO with Consultative Status with the United Nations. WAFW program is an innovative leadership initiative to empower university students, focusing on developing young women for leadership roles that will address and achieve the United Nations' Sustainable Development Goals (UN SDGs).

National & Local: Corder joined and served as a member of the White House Council on Women & Girls under the Obama Administration in 2016. Corder is also the current Mayoral Appointed Executive Member for the City of Toledo, Human Relations Commission, Past- President of the American Association of University Women (AAUW)-Toledo Branch, and serves the City of Toledo's Committee on the Elimination of Discrimination against Women (CEDAW) ordinance. Corder's accomplishments as a local advocate include passing CEDAW, ref: O-095-22 in 2022. As a Cities for CEDAW, it will support Women of Toledo's effort to encourage local governments to become more gender equitable. In 2019, Corder also advocated and supported the passing of the Pay Equity Act in the City of Toledo. The passing of this legislation is a critical step to closing the gender pay gap and improving women's economic status. In 2023, Corder accepted a Mayoral appointed position voted by the Toledo City Councils to serve as a Commissioner Member of the CEDAW Gender Equity Commission under the Diversity and Inclusion division for the City of Toledo.

Under Corder's management, Women of Toledo's Economic Empowerment & Workforce Diversity Initiatives announced the establishment of the Northwest Ohio Women's Business Council (WBC) in 2022. The Council was created based on the evidence and data collected by the City of Toledo Forward Cities E3: Equity for Every Entrepreneur research in 2021 (link to the scorecard). There are four essential categories to support the entrepreneurial ecosystem - People, Programs, Networks, and Narratives. WBC program's goals are to support the narrative aspect of the identity and storytelling of the ecosystem's story in a way that highlights its personality and diversity. Women of Toledo have been working on closing the network gap for minority businesses through mentorship and with this WBC effort, the organization will continue its goal of advocating for economic inequality for all women.

In 2023, Corder also joined the University of Toledo <u>ADVANCE Catalyst team</u> as an External Evaluator, a grant project funded by the <u>National Science Foundation</u> (NSF), Division of Equity for Excellence in STEM. The University of Toledo will undertake an institutional self-assessment to identify potential organizational inequities (unjust or unfair) policies and practices that result in differential professional outcomes for some STEM faculty. The ADVANCE Catalyst project will result in a five-year STEM faculty equity plan tailored to the University of Toledo context and institutional data that will guide institutional actions to address any issues identified during the grant. This project aligns with Corder's passion for tackling issues critical to women's economic advancement and interrupting various biases in the workplace and community in the STEM field.

Professional Careers: Corder's past career included being the Chief of Operations for So Now Professional Network for Women, Program Director for the Pay It Forward Foundation, and Special Project Coordinator for the Toledo Metropolitan Council of Government (TMACOG). Also, Corder was recognized as the Power of Women for the Junior League of Toledo, served as a Chairperson for the Secor Artist Network, Steering Committee for Women of The World (WOW) Symposium, and an Ambassador for the Momentum Northwest Ohio Young Women's Summit. In 2021, Corder also served as a committee member for Women Fore Solheim. The Women Fore Solheim, founded in 2021, is a collaboration of diverse women in the Greater Toledo community who are committed to creating and implementing inclusive and equitable opportunities and experiences during the Solheim Cup. Passionate about migration issues, Corder joined Welcome Toledo-Lucas County, an initiative that works to build a more welcoming and inclusive community for immigrants and people of diverse cultures that supports a vibrant civic, economic, and social fabric for all. Welcome TLC is a collaboration of community partners housed in the Toledo Lucas County Public Library in partnership with the Board of Lucas County Commissioners and the City of Toledo Human Relations



Commission. Through collective efforts between the Welcome TLC team and city-county local government, the City of Toledo and Lucas County received the certification as Welcoming City and County by Welcoming America. With Welcome TLC, Corder oversees the Workforce Economic Development workgroup committees as the Co-Chairperson.

Corder's major recognition was to be named the region 2021 **Jefferson Award** and represent the region in Washington D.C. The Jefferson Awards are known as "an American Nobel Prize for public service." Since its founding in 1972 by Jacqueline Kennedy Onassis, Sam Beard, and Senator Robert Taft, Jr., the Jefferson Awards has honored outstanding community and public service. Corder is also the awardee of the **Ernest M. Pon Award** by the National Association for Ethnic Studies, which recognizes Asian American organizations dedicated to human rights and equal justice. The Ernest M. Pon Award is offered in recognition of those who have achieved a level of innovation, quality, and success in advancing the field of Ethnic Studies that few others have done. Followed by recognition in 2023 for **Women Who SHINE** by the Sisters of Notre Dame of the United States for exemplifying excellence in Corder's ability to empower. In 2024, Corder's recognition includes **Women Making Change** with JC Penny Corporation, **Women on the Rise** Honoree with YWCA, and the University of Toledo, and Judith Herb College of Education **Distinguished Alumni Award**.

Corder earned both her master's and bachelor's Degrees from the University of Toledo and completed her post-doctoral Ed. D. with Northcentral University in Organizational Leadership. She is also a trainer and certified Human Rights Advocate with the Office of the High Commissioner for Human Rights (OHCHR) and the US Institute of Diplomacy and Human Rights (USIDHR).

Corder's proudest accomplishment will always be the opportunity to be a mother to Isabella Ashira Corder, who recently graduated with her master's degree at Columbia University, New York.
